<b>Introduction</b>	<b>Capture Attention:</b> Speaker creates excitement, compels audience to listen with opening thought / strong delivery.				
	<b>Audience Adaptation:</b> Provides clear reason(s) why topic is important. Defines unfamiliar jargon or terminology. Makes information accessible.				
	<b>Established Credibility:</b> Proves expertise to audience. Delivery supports mastery of subject. Dress appropriate for occasion.				
	<b>Clear Thesis and Preview:</b> Point of presentation evident. Supporting points are easy to identify / remember by audience.				
<b>Body</b>	<b>Main Points:</b> Clearly organized. Strongly introduced.				
	<b>Support:</b> Appropriate illustrations and examples to support claims. Properly cites materials.				
	<b>Transitions:</b> Movement from points is deliberate; easy to recognize changes in thought.				
<b>Conclusion</b>	<b>Signal End of Speech:</b> Indicates speech is closing.				
	<b>Review of Main Points:</b> Thesis & main points restated. Concepts are separate; reviewed.				
	<b>Closing Thought:</b> Uses stories, quotes, and/or examples, and delivery to make positive final impression.				
<b>Delivery</b>	<b>Eye contact:</b> Speaker maintains solid eye contact. Use of notes kept to minimum.				
	<b>Volume:</b> Easily heard; changes reflect emotions.				
	<b>Rate:</b> Easy to follow; uses pacing to emphasize important information.				
	<b>Vocal Variety:</b> Conversational quality, expressive. Enthusiastic delivery.				
	<b>Verbal Pauses:</b> (Uhs, Ums, Likes) are at a minimum. Flow of the speech is not interrupted.				
<b>Visual Aids</b>	<b>Construction:</b> Professional, simple (no clutter); paragraphs avoided. Elements are large. Contribution is purposeful (complements message). Effectively uses color.				
	<b>Presentation:</b> Interacts with VA effectively, coherent explanation. Is audience-inclusive.
